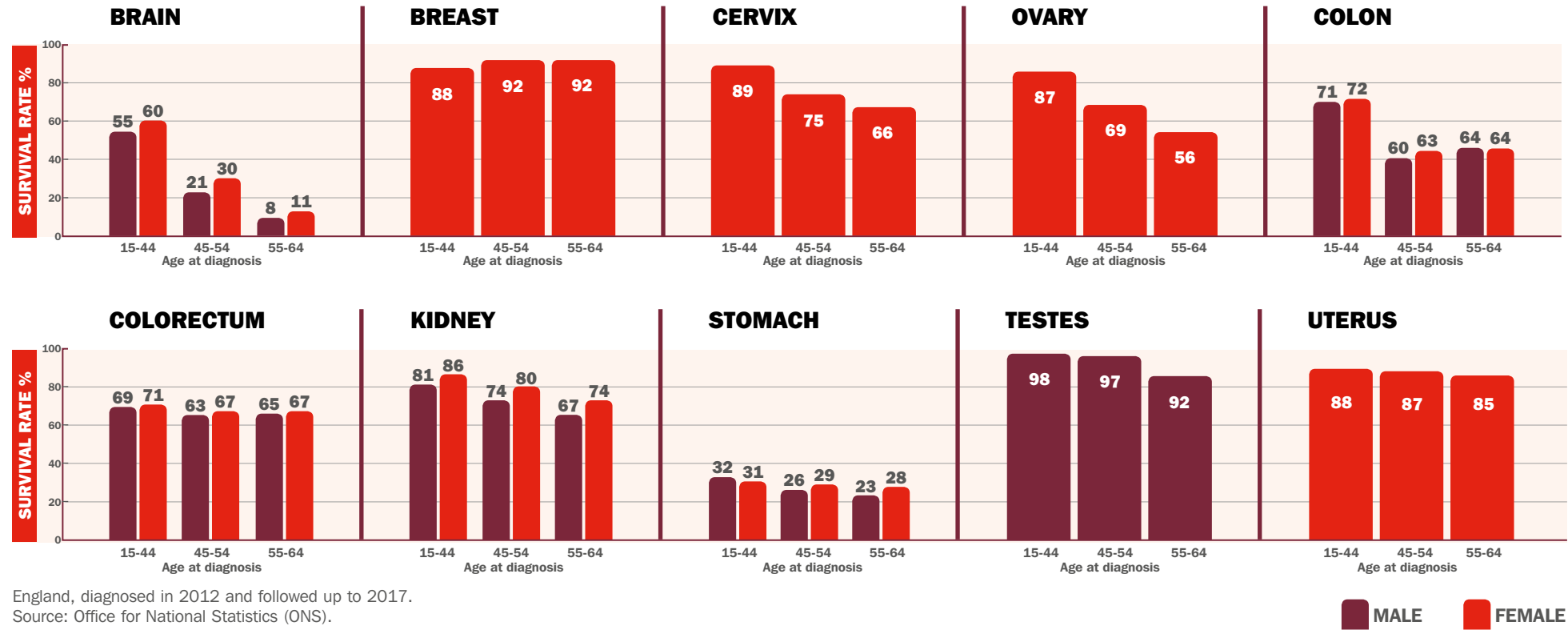


What are the chances of surviving cancer?

The following figures show the five-year survival rate by cancer type and age at diagnosis.

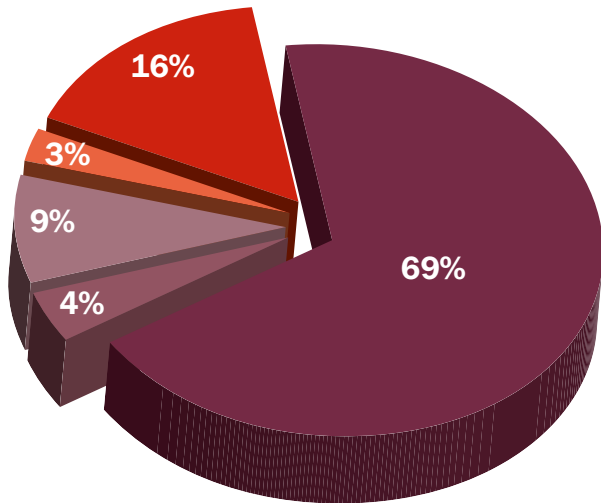


England, diagnosed in 2012 and followed up to 2017.

Common claims

The chart below represents the most common claims under a Canada Life Critical Illness policy in 2018.



Cancer	69%
Stroke (CVA)	4%
Heart disease (CAD+MI)	9%
Multiple Sclerosis	3%
Other	16%

1 in 2 people in the UK born after 1960 will be diagnosed with some form of cancer during their lifetime.

Therefore, perhaps unsurprisingly, the vast majority of Critical Illness claims are related to cancer.*
